

Research Committee

<p>Composition & Tenure</p>	<p>Shall consist of: the President, the Vice President, the third most recent Past-President, and two co-chairs holding either <i>Senior</i> member status, or <i>Research Scientist</i> member status. One co-chair shall be an M.D., and the other a Ph.D. (or M.D., Ph.D.). The Committee shall include the previous co-chairs, other ASNR members, including a <i>Member-in-Training</i> appointed by the President, and other individuals judged to be able to provide valuable expertise. The co-chairs shall serve for a three-year term.</p>
<p>Responsibility</p>	<p>With the approval of the Executive Committee, shall be responsible for fostering research in neuroradiology, for overseeing researchers and research activities funded by or through the Society. As directed by the Executive Committee, the Research Committee shall be responsible for supervising and judging the application or competition for awards and prizes bestowed by the Society (e.g., <i>The Cornelius G. Dyke Memorial Award</i>). The Research Committee shall recommend recipients to the Administrative Committee, which must approve all awards. The Research Committee shall monitor the progress of funded individuals or proposals as appropriate. The Research Committee, with the approval of the Executive Committee, shall be responsible for fostering research in neuroradiology and for overseeing researchers and research activities funded by or through the Society.</p>
<p>Goals</p>	<p>◆ Primary Goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Support collaboration amongst basic science (PhD scientists) and clinical research (MD scientists) in the Society for educational and research opportunities. ◆ Develop a strategy for increasing NIH funding for neuroradiology-oriented projects. ◆ Provide educational and other support activities to encourage research by ASNR members. ◆ Develop initiatives to enhance the value of the Annual Meeting for neuroimaging investigators, and attract their participation ◆ Develop a strategy that encourages good quality submissions to the <i>AJNR</i> and to the Foundation-sponsored grants. ◆ Revise Foundation grant guidelines to enhance greater participation in the wide range of experience of ASNR members. <p>Continuing Goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Make recommendations to the Foundation regarding the support of research, including specific projects, through Foundation funding of the ASNR. ◆ Maintain documentation on all current and former funded projects through the Foundation. ◆ Update and maintain the Research Committee website, such that it is a useful tool for Society members seeking information regarding neuroradiology research. ◆ Develop a relationship with ACRIN, and advise and recommend to that body prospective clinical trials that assess neuroradiology techniques or procedures. ◆ Foster collaboration with other organizations involved in Neuroimaging research, including the Radiological Society of North America (RSNA), International Society for Magnetic Resonance in Medicine (ISMRM), Organization for Human Brain Mapping (OHBM), and the Society for Neurosciences (SfN). ◆ Foster health services research in neuroradiology by overseeing the activities of the Committee for Evidence Based Medicine (formerly Clinical Outcomes Research Subcommittee of the Research Committee). ◆ To maintain contact with NIH agencies which support neuroradiological research, so as to influence submissions of RFAs and RFPs.
